#### Superintendent Minister's Letter: 'Mustard Seed'

'How shall we picture the Kingdom of God, or what parable shall we use to describe it? It is like a mustard seed; when sown in the ground it is smaller than any other seed, but once sown, it springs up and grows taller than any other plant, and forms branches so large that birds can roost in its shade' (Mark 4:30-32)

#### Dear friends,

Jesus loved to tell parables like this one which were drawn from people's own experiences of life and their own observations of the world. He regularly told stories that made people think about how events they had seen with their own eyes could relate to their own faith in the living God.

The parable of the mustard seed is an example of a 'Parable of growth'. A parable which shows the way in which under God's loving care and guidance, his Kingdom can grow from something as small, and apparently insignificant as a tiny mustard seed to become so large as a bush large enough that even birds can roost in its shade.

This parable is a reminder that a tiny seed of faith, sown in the heart of a believer at a young age can, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the help and support of a loving church family can become something great and strong in later life. How many great lives of faith from the early Prophets to the great Christian leaders of our time have come from small and humble beginnings? How many great things from the abolition of slavery to the fall of Apartheid have been achieved by people of faith from humble origins.

I continue to believe that despite a narrative of decline, our churches continue to be exciting places of growth where lives are changed as God's purposes are found and nurtured. Just look around the churches of our circuit and you will see countless examples of initiatives driven by ordinary people of faith with a passion for what they believe in. From weekly fellowship groups, circuit youth work or Toddler church, scores of people


work by regularly sowing those seeds of faith that they know have the ability to grow to something of significance in their world.

May we be encouraged to sows those seeds of faith with hope and confidence in our world. May we know that under God's guidance, these seeds will grow to bear the fruits of his bountiful Grace, this day and forevermore.

### **Bible Month June 2024: Exploring Genesis**



'Genesis is the starting point for all Christian theology and explores many of the foundational questions of life and faith: 'Who is God', 'What is God like?', 'How does God interact with the world?', 'How is that world meant to be?', 'What does it mean to be human?', 'What does it look like to be God's people'...

Through the book, we get to journey with many different characters as they wrestle (sometimes literally!) with finding answers to these questions in the midst of the messiness and uncertainty of life.'

#### Bible Month – what will it look like?

Following positive engagement with the books of Revelation and Isaiah over Bible month in the last two years, the Blackheath and Crystal Palace Circuit is hoping to engage with this year's Bible Month in June exploring the book of Genesis. Churches are encouraged to engage with this material through Sunday worship, Bible studies, fellowship discussions and any other ways they may see fit. The stories of Genesis divide neatly into 4 bit-sized chunks, which we'll take each at a time over 4 weeks:

Week 1: 2<sup>nd</sup> June The Sovereign God who Creates (Chapters 1-11)

Exploring God's creation of heaven, Earth and humanity and how God reaffirms God's covenant and promise after the flood with Noah.

Week 2: 9th June The God who Calls and Blesses (Chapters 12-25)

Exploring God's relationship with Abram and Sarai and their rocky journey as they are called from their homeland, promised numerous descendants and are eventually blessed with their son Isaac.

**Week 3: 16<sup>th</sup> June** The God who Comes to People in their Struggles (Chapters 25-36) Exploring the volatile relationship between Isaac's twin sons, Jacob and Esau, and how Jacob is transformed by an encounter with the divine in preparation for their reconciliation.

**Week 4: 23<sup>rd</sup> June** The God who Confirms and Safeguards Divine Promises (Chapters 37-50) Exploring the story of Joseph as God cares for him, his estranged family, and his future through the turmoil of enslavement, prison, and foreign powers.

#### **Resourcing Bible Month**


The 'Bible Month–Genesis' resource booklet will be circulated to every church and local preacher in the circuit to enhance worship preparations for both preachers and local arrangements. The booklet contains weekly theological reflections from esteemed Biblical scholars, service preparation ideas, possible preaching points, interactive resources, and small group study guides.

## Circuit Easter Offering Dedication Service – 'Let Justice Roll' 4.30pm on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2024 at Forest Hill Methodist Church

Hebrews 10:25 says: 'And let us not neglect our meeting together as some people do but encourage one another especially now that the day of His return is drawing near.' Coming together as a Circuit is a wonderful opportunity to gather as worshippers, to acknowledge and give thanks for the generosity of our people for the work of God. This act of worship when we dedicate our Easter Offering is always an inspiring and meaningful service when we hear how the World Mission Fund supports God's mission in different parts of the world. The theme this year 'Let Justice Roll' tied in very well with 'A Justice Seeking Church', our claim from Walking with Micah project, and Let Justice Flow Lent Bible Study course prepared by Rev. During the service we heard powerful stories from across the world of how the money we have donated previously has been part of changing communities and lives. Rev. Richard Grocott also paid tribute to Ira Fernando who passed away on 24th March 2024, highlighting how she showed so much commitment to Mission in our Church and Circuit for many years. ## Wondering if you're called to be...a worship leader? Accredited Worship Leader Training

With many of our churches undertaking more local arrangement services each quarter, more people are becoming involved in the leading acts of worship within our communities.

While the circuit has previously offered unaccredited training days for those now leading worship in specific areas, we want to offer the opportunity for individuals locally to explore accredited worship leader training with the Methodist Church in Britain if they wish.

This training can be facilitated locally and would seek to gather worship leaders together from across the circuit.

There are 3 different levels of accreditation that can be explored, all of them draw on materials from the Local preachers and Worship Leaders training and incorporate devotionals, communal learning, self-directed study, and reflection tasks:

- Level 1: The lowest level completes the 'Encountering God in the life of the church' module and culminates in one assessed service and one submitted piece of work. (locally accredited)
- Level 2: Mid-level Adds a second module on 'Encountering God in daily life' onto Level 1 and culminates in an assessed service and two submission pieces. (locally accredited)
- Level 3: The highest level This is the completion of 4 modules of the course (an additional two to the 2<sup>nd</sup> level) with an assessed service. The portfolio is assessed Connexionally and, if acceptable, forms half of the local preachers training course onto which worship leaders can continue if desired.

Anyone who has completed Levels 1, 2 or 3 is entitled, subject to the confirmation of the Local Preachers' Meeting, to be appointed as a Worship Leader in their local church.

This training both offers the opportunity for communal learning, personal upskilling, and an accredited recognition of the work/learning.

## **Blackheath and Crystal Palace Circuit Envisioning Update on progress from the Way Forward Group**

#### **Progress report, Spiritual Growth:**

- The Circuit now subscribes to 'The Vine', a resource produced by Twelve Baskets that provides weekly service material. This is being circulated widely to ministers, preachers, worship leaders, and others involved in leading worship. The material is already in use and provides a good alternative to Roots.
- Church Mission plans are being discussed locally for bringing forward to the Circuit. Several churches are already working on positive ideas and initiatives. It was agreed that it would be helpful if at least one of the Circuit reps from each church was on their missions planning group to facilitate two-way communication.
- Date of next Circuit Property Group Meeting 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024, 7.30pm at Burnt Ash. On the agenda will be a 'net zero' strategy for churches and manses. Some work has already been done on this with, for example, the improved insulation of the manses.

#### **Progress report, Future Shape of the Circuit:**

- There has been some good engagement with the Circuit Restructuring document. It is acknowledged that there are some concerns which will be taken seriously and discussed as appropriate.
- The Way Forward Group is organising a Circuit wide gathering called 'Our Circuit, Our Future' on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> September at Burnt Ash, 10am to 1pm. This could include a 'Bring and Share' meal. The meeting would open with an act of worship organised by Craig and the Circuit youth group. Further details to follow.

The Way Forward Group meets via zoom and is open to anyone who wishes to contribute to discussions regarding the future of the Circuit in terms of Spiritual Growth and Restructuring. Some of you may have received an email from Rev. William Davis regarding a Mission Trip to Ghana, departing Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September and returning Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> October 2024; this is to give you further details, and to extend the invitation to members across our Circuit.

Rev. William Davis has been involved in these trips since 2009, with several trips each year since then (excluding covid years). Those attending come from Circuits across the London District, and include Presbyters and members interested in the aims of the trip. The overall objective is to explore the faith in the Ghanaian context by interacting with both the clergy and lay in the urban and rural settings and to understand the concept of mission and evangelism. The group will visit some historical sites eg. Cape Coast Castle and projects that are being or have been sponsored by the Methodist Church Britain.

The invitation is open to anyone in the Blackheath & Crustal Palace Circuit, but early booking is essential as there are **only ten places available**. The total cost involved is £2,000, and this is for the flight, 4-star hotel accommodation, hiring of air-conditioned coach, meals and other miscellaneous expenses. Please contact Rev. William Davis if you wish to reserve a place on the trip.

The brief itinerary includes:

- paying a courtesy call on the staff at the Conference Office in Accra
- visiting the Methodist Rafiki Satellite Village (Orphanage) in the Winneba Diocese, to have a session with the children.
- a visit to Cape Coast Castle, to be briefed about the slave trade/ visit Sekondi Diocese.
- In the Northern Region (Tamale/Yendi), we will visit another area to explore the relationship between Christians and Muslims and we will visit some of the rural Methodist Churches to interact with the local people.

We are humbly inviting you to be part of this exciting trip to Ghana. The payment schedule will be paying £1,000 by  $31^{st}$  July 2024 and the remaining amount will be collected at the airport before we depart to Ghana.










#### The Current Picture

In 2023 we saw a 37% increase in demand compared to 2022. We also saw an increase in people needing support from our Fuelbank and our Essentials fund (www.acts435.org).



We have been working closely with the Council and a number of local organisations (Deptford Reach, Citizens Advice, LADPP, SELCE and Community Connections Lewisham) to improve accessibility to advice services and connection into local support for those who visit our foodbanks. We still hope and pray for the day when we no longer need foodbanks.
