Superintendent Minister's Letter



Dear friends,

'For everything its season, and for every activity under heaven its time: A time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and at time to uproot; A time to weep and a time to laugh a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing' Ecclesiastes 3: 1–5 (Edited)

The wise sage who wrote the book of Ecclesiastes, tells us, in the verses cited above, that there is a time for everything in God's kingdom. A time for us to start new endeavours in life, and a time to recognize that those endeavours have come to an end. There is a natural flow to the progress of life as we reach certain milestones and prepare for the next challenge that lies ahead.

For me, as your Superintendent Minister, I am getting close to one such milestone. It may only seem like yesterday to many of you and to me also, but seven years ago, in September 2018, I began this phase of my ministry with you as your circuit Superintendent. Now, seven years later, I am coming towards the end of that ministry and am preparing to move on to our neighbouring circuit of Croydon, where I will begin my Ministry in September as their new Superintendent Minister.

Seven years of being alongside so many of you during significant moments in your lives including weddings, funerals, and baptism, particularly in the two churches of Lewisham and Eltham Park where I have had Pastoral charge.

There have been times when we have looked at difficult issues such as the 'God in Love Unites us' agenda, and latterly the circuit re-organisation. We also lost the best part of two years of face-to-face ministry as we navigated the Covid Epidemic together and learned how to meet and even share worship through platforms such as Zoom and YouTube!

Soon will come that time for us to refrain from embracing. It will be with great sadness that Carol and I say our last goodbyes at our leaving service in late July. However, we will do so knowing that we won't be far away in Croydon and we hope to keep up many of the meaningful friendships that we have made.

This will be the third consecutive appointment in which I will have served seven years. Seven is a Biblical number, remember God made the world in seven days according to Genesis. Seven is understood as a number that signifies completeness and there is a sense in which I feel ready to complete my ministry with you and move on to new pastures.

As I go, I want to promise that I will keep you all in my prayers, happy in the knowledge that our circuit remains in good hands and that God's purposes will continue to be fulfilled. Kind regards,

Action for Children is the children's charity of the Methodist Church. It was founded in 1869 by Methodist minister Revd Thomas Bowman Stephenson in response to the poverty and danger faced by vulnerable and destitute children and young people living rough on the streets of London.

Today, Action for Children, (formerly, NCH - National Children's Homes) has grown to become a leading children's charity running over 500 projects and working with more children and young people affected by poverty, disability and abuse than any other UK charity.

Action for Children Sunday is held on the **second Sunday of July.** It is the anniversary of the opening of the first children's home and a chance to celebrate the work of Action for Children and its partnership with the Church at services and activities throughout the country.

The Action for Children Covenant

Every child has the right to live, to be safe and to be loved. Every young person has the right to be housed, to have enough money to live in dignity and to have enough support for the future. Every young person has the right to justice, to realise their potential and to be given the space to become independent. In an often cruel and imperfect world, we uphold the work of Action for Children with children and young people in danger, in need and at risk. We support the growth of this work and the pursuit of all these rights for the young, the discounted and the vulnerable. We make this covenant with Action for Children for the sake of all God's children.




Weekly Thursday Morning zoom Bible Study Finding 'The Way' together

Each year the Easter offering service is organised by Methodist Women In Britain and money raised goes to the World Mission Fund of the Methodist Church in Britain, working with over 100 Partner Churches and Organisations around the World.

The worship service was very inspiring and meaningful, we heard how the World Mission Fund supports God's Mission in different parts of the World. The theme this year was "Education for All Hope for All", and the service focussed on the right of every person to receive an education. This year's stories were from Countries or Women Missionaries way back who worked very hard believing that by educating both boys and girls basic schooling could bring transformation to people's lives, bring healing in communities and cultural friendships.

We were pleased to welcome our Guest Preacher who this year was the District Chair Rev. Dr. Jonathan Dean. Report on District Safeguarding Conference Saturday 15th March 2025 by Rev. Charles ILunga

This conference, entitled "Unbounded Love" was well attended by no less than 100 people, 10 of them from our Circuit. The Keynote speech was given by the Vice-President of Conference, Carolyn Godfrey. Opening devotions were led by Rev. Esther Akam with a Congolese chant and she spoke of creating a supporting culture where people felt valued, respected and safe. The District Safeguarding Officer, Claire De Stephano welcomed everyone to the conference.

The Vice-President of Conference, Carolyn Godfrey spoke of how Safeguarding is interpreted in our own eyes, vulnerability and the use and abuse of power. She invited us to reflect on the power we hold in our relationships, in our workplaces and in the offices, and in the church. We were asked to consider what kind of leadership we are supposed to offer in the life of the Church, the power we hold, the power people see in us and how we respond to vulnerability. She spoke of the importance of understanding where power lies and treating people with respect and how all are worthy of equal value and dignity.

The District Chair, Rev. Dr. Jonathan Dean then, addressed the meeting speaking of how we aim for life of heaven demonstrated on earth. He invited us to revisit "Called to love and Praise" and referred to the "God Welcomes All" study guide on how faith informs safeguarding.

There followed four pre-arranged workshops to discuss:

- 'Supporting Children and young people's emotional wellbeing'
- 'Survivors of Abuse' led by Kate Little
- 'Embedding Good Practice in Daily Life'
- 'Safeguarding Marginalised Communities'

Invitation to Mission Trip to Ghana Saturday 24th January to Thursday 5th February 2026

The overall objective is to learn about the life and ministry of the Methodist Church Ghana and explore the faith in the Ghanaian context by interacting with both the clergy and lay in the urban and rural settings, to learn from the dynamic growth of the Methodist Church Ghana and how this has been achieved and understand the concept of mission and evangelism, to engage with the history of Methodism and the history of the slave trade and visit projects that are being or have been sponsored by the Methodist Church Britain as well as visit places of interest.

The brief itinerary includes:

- paying a courtesy call on the staff at the Conference Office in Accra
- visiting the Methodist Rafiki Satellite Village (Orphanage) in the Winneba Diocese, to have a session with the children.
- a visit to Cape Coast Castle, to be briefed about the slave trade and visit Sekondi Diocese.
- Engagement with young people, men's and women's fellowship
- Visits to educational institutions and Health Clinics
- In the Northern Region (Tamale/Yendi), we will visit another area to explore the relationship between Christians and Muslims and we will visit some of the rural Methodist Churches to interact with the local people.

The total cost involved is £2,200, and this is for the flight, hotel accommodation, hiring of air-conditioned coach, meals and other miscellaneous expenses. The payment schedule will be paying £1,000 by Wednesday 15th October 2025 and the remaining amount will be collected at the airport before we depart to Ghana.

We are humbly inviting you to be part of this exciting trip to Ghana.
