Dear friends,

Mothering Sunday

The fourth Sunday of Lent every year is known as 'Mothering Sunday' or 'Mother's Day'. Traditionally, it goes back to the days when many children worked as domestic servants in wealthy homes. On this Sunday, the children were allowed to go home to visit their mothers. Many would collect wild flowers along the way and present them on arrival to their mothers.

This year, on March 10th, millions of people all over the country and all over the world will be giving cards, bunches of flowers, boxes of chocolates and other tokens of love to their mothers. On this special day, we want to give thanks to God for the love of our mothers who brought us into the world, cared and nurtured us through our infancy and childhood, reared us through adolescence and set us on our path into life.




Weekly Thursday Morning zoom Bible Study Finding 'The Way' together

LENT STUDY COURSES AROUND THE CIRCUIT

'Let Justice Flow' is a six-week Bible study based on the ministry of the Old Testament prophet Amos. The study raises deep and searching questions of faith: What kind of God would allow such pain and suffering to occur in his world? Can God's people expect protection from natural or human-made disasters? The study also addresses issues of social justice, which are present throughout the Book of Amos. These issues are then situated within our current time through the report 'A Justice-seeking Church'. The Methodist Conference of 2023 adopted this report and commended it to the wider Methodist Church (throughout Great Britain) for prayerful study and action. It is a response to our calling as Christians to explore what it means to act justly, love kindness and walk humbly with God which is seen as integral to a Methodist way of life. The aim of this study is to challenge comfortable faith, whilst also feeding and nourishing those who seek to better understand their world and their place within God's creation.



Blackheath and Crystal Palace Circuit Envisioning Update on progress from the Way Forward Group

Progress report, Spiritual Growth:

- Prayer handbook: The Circuit Leadership Team have received very positive feedback. The prayer handbooks are proving to be a valuable resource, and it has been agreed that they will be ordered annually from now on. Churches will be supplied with ten copies for use in fellowship groups etc.
- Lent Bible Study: The CLT were delighted to see in print the Lent Study Course written by Rev. Richard Grocott, 'Let Justice Flow'. This study is based on the Book of Amos and was written by Richard during his sabbatical. Details of Lent courses around the Circuit are available in this newsletter.
- Bible month: The Circuit will once again engage with 'Bible Month'. Services during June 2024 will focus on the Book of Genesis; further details to be circulated nearer the time.
- Craig continues to support Youth across the Circuit. The next quarterly youth service at Hither Green is on 21st April. The Circuit will once again be supporting Craig with his commitment to 3Generate. The event, at Birmingham, will be 4th-6th October and Craig is inviting young people aged 8-23 to contact him if they would like to attend.

Progress report, Future Shape of the Circuit:

From September 2025 the Circuit is likely to reduce to three ministers. Discussions as to how this can be most sensibly achieved are in progress, and ongoing. It is recognised that reducing to three ministers will put considerable strain on the Circuit in terms of preacher availability, pastoral support and administration. The Way Forward Group have recently met with a representative from another Circuit where lay workers play an important role in supporting ministers and churches. This has given the group 'food for thought'.

Churches across the Circuit are being reminded that they should produce Mission plans. These are to be presented at church Council meetings in the Spring of 2024. Once these have been approved at church level, they will be

presented at the Summer Circuit meeting. These mission plans (Our Church's Future Story) are extremely important for future planning and are intended to provide not only an idea of strengths and weaknesses, but how resources can be targeted and shared.

The Way Forward Group meets via zoom and is open to anyone who wishes to contribute to discussions regarding the future of the Circuit in terms of Spiritual Growth and Reconfiguring. If you are interested in finding our more please contact Garry Young for further details.

'Safer Internet': A reminder of the need to stay safe when online written by Claire De Stefano, District Safeguarding Officer

More apps, more accounts and more passwords create more opportunities for theft. Meanwhile, human nature stays the same. '123456' is still the most used password in the world!

How to better protect your Accounts

Reusing passwords across all platforms makes them less safe. For example, if you use the same password for a TV streaming service and your online bank service, a data breach at one could put the other at risk. This applies to passwords that are similar with small tweaks.

Make your Passwords impossible to guess.

When coming up with passwords, people tend to gravitate toward the same themes, favourite football teams, memorable dates, pet's names for example. Always try to avoid using passwords with any personal significance. Passwords that are longer than 12 characters with plenty of numbers, letters and special symbols are recommended.

Top tips:

- Change passwords periodically.
- Never repeat passwords.
- Use lowercase, capital letters and special characters.
- Never include personal information.
- And most importantly- NEVER SHARE YOUR PASSWORD


