Superintendent Minister's Letter

Dear friends,

Moving on with God

'Foxes have their holes and birds their roosts, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his hat' (Matthew 8:20)

'Doesn't time fly by quickly, it only seems like yesterday that you arrived!', so commented one of the kind ladies in a fellowship group I was leading recently as I was explaining that I will soon be moving on from the Blackheath & Crystal Palace circuit after seven years as your Superintendent Minister!

In some respects, yes time has flown, and memories of my arrival and early days of ministry, particularly at Lewisham and Eltham Park seem very recent. In other respects, I feel that together we have achieved a lot as a circuit these past seven years. I look back with great affection on some of the great times we have shared together, including significant acts of worship, parties and weddings, baptism and celebrations of life. I remember with joy all those recorded services we put together whilst our churches were closed during the Covid epidemic. I remember fellowship meetings, Bible studies and lots of committee meetings where we struggled to make sense of Christian faith in difficult times but were for ever sure of our Lord's presence with us. I will always hold fond memories of you, the people of the Circuit.

As a Methodist Minister, now in my 35th year of travel, I have got used to the idea of 'Moving on' after each appointment. I am now coming towards the end of my sixth circuit appointment and will soon be moving to my seventh. Last year, I once again went through the 'Stationing process' and was matched with the Croydon circuit as Superintendent Minister. Following a matching visit last November, Carol and I agreed to this move, as have the Croydon circuit. Conference willing, we will be moving in August and will take up the appointment in September. We continue to feel excited by this appointment, the new friends we will make, the new churches we will serve, the

new opportunities for mission and outreach. We feel ready to take up one more fresh challenge.

Moving house, moving job or even moving church is never an easy process. The thought of another house removal and settling into a new house feels rather daunting. Nevertheless, in the verse quoted above, Jesus seems to suggest to his disciples that when on Mission, Christian leaders should avoid putting down roots that are too deep. The message is to travel light and be ready to embrace change for the benefit of the Kingdom of God.

Of course, there are often good reasons why it is simply not practical for us to 'up sticks' at short notice. Sometimes our calling in the Christian life is to stay where we are and see through the work God has entrusted us with. Yet what these verses are perhaps suggesting is that all of us need to be flexible in life and willing to embrace change when it is presented to us.

My prayer is that as we prepare for the changes that the next year will bring, we may all remain open to the ways of the Holy Spirit and eager to discern his purposes for our lives, and the lives of our church,







and for our 'Mother Church'.





London Freedom Walk 2025 christian ald

Enjoy the sights of the city from a different perspective as you join us on a five-mile route, calling at London's iconic churches, where walkers will discover their history and the stories behind the work they do. The event marks the start of **Christian Aid Week 2025**, which raises money to support communities working to free themselves from poverty and tackle the challenges of the climate crisis.

What's happening?

The third London Freedom Walk takes place on Saturday, 10th May 2025.

It sets off from St Martin-in-the-Fields ... follows a family-friendly five-mile route ... calls in at some of the city's churches, where walkers will discover their history and the stories behind the work they do.

The walk will start at St Martin-in-the-Fields, Trafalgar Square London WC2N 4JJ and end at St Paul's Cathedral, in time for the 5pm Evensong.

Why are you doing this?

The event marks the start of Christian Aid Week 2025, which raises money to support communities working to tackle the challenges of poverty and the climate crisis. Every year, the charity's supporters around the country have seven days and so many ways to help make a difference, and walkers in London are doing their bit by stepping out around the capital.

What is Christian Aid Week all about this year?

This year the Christian Aid Week appeal is focusing on the work of the organisation's partners in Guatemala. Guatemala is among the ten countries in the world most vulnerable to disasters and climate emergencies. Over the past three years, extended dry seasons have severely damaged the livelihoods of subsistence farmers, who rely upon rain for their crops.
