Blackheath and Crystal Palace Circuit Envisioning Update on progress from the Way Forward Group

Property & Resources Group

The Property and Resources Group held their annual gathering on Wednesday 5th June 2024, 7.30pm, Burnt Ash Methodist Church. 14 members from 7 churches were present. The following is a summary of discussions:

1. Sharing good practice:

- Energy deals: Better to go to Companies direct; but check that you are comparing like with like.
- PAT testing can be costly but is a legal requirement.
- Annual Gas safety, and Fire extinguisher checks are a legal requirement
- Insurance inspection: All the above checks/testing are taken into account when the insurance inspection is carried out

2. Items for discussion:

- Solar panels: There are questions of the soundness of the roof; and planning permission is necessary. However, if churches did wish to pursue this, there may, later this year, be funds available via the Connexion.
- Hall lettings charges should be reflective of other lets in the area and utility costs. They should be reviewed/increased every year. Rates would normally be for the hire of a room, with an additional charge for a kitchen, outside space, or additional storage. Some churches offer limited 'one off' lets but these can be problematic.

• **Hither Green** currently has an issue with a stair lift that is out of action. DAF funding might be available as accessibility is a legal requirement.

Anerley: Following flooding from a burst water main, Thames Water have dried out the affected areas and employed contractors to relay floors and redecorate.

Upper Norwood: The Quinquennial report highlighted RAAC concrete is ceiling panels in the hall. Following an inspection by a structural engineer, temporary propping of all slabs is to be carried out. Further action may be needed in the future. The hall also needs rewiring.

Eltham Park: Masonry over the front entrance (which is currently closed) is crumbling and needs replacing. Scaffolding will be required.

District Support: Richard advised that Tom Winter, the new District property person lives in Eltham and is very happy to assist on any property issue.

3. 'Way Forward' proposals/Mission planning

Mission plans are to be with the Circuit Administrator by the end of June. One of the issues concerning property/lettings is access for all.

Churches in the Circuit have been asked by the Circuit Leadership team to consider where they are currently, and where they might move forward to in the future.

Listed below are the issues that consistently recurred:

1. Worship and Spiritual Growth

Our churches are recognised as welcoming, friendly and inclusive, although there is a need to regularly review access needs.

A desire for our churches to be grounded in prayer, with more opportunities to enter churches outside Sunday worship for individual/group prayer.

Preachers are to be encouraged to be more open to exploring new ways of worshipping God, not only in Sunday services which could be more 'cheerful' and 'vibrant', but through prayer groups, Bible study, and other opportunities for worship other than on a Sunday. Worship bands and/or choirs could enhance worship. Preachers should be encouraged to link their sermons and prayers more closely to big global issues. They should include more Bible stories, and could make sermons shorter.

The use of people's gifts and talents through involvement in LAs is generally welcomed.

More zoom services requested.

2. Communication

It was almost universally acknowledged that our churches are not 'visible' enough in their local communities. There is a need for improved communication and publicity with and to the local community through on-line, physical and verbal means. More communication with support groups and other community groups (both those that use our remises and beyond) is to be fostered and encouraged.

3. Community Outreach

It was almost universally acknowledged that our churches are not doing enough to understand the needs of their local community. Simple initiatives might include inviting more groups to use existing facilities (including the church as well as halls) and making other areas of the premises more widely available. Lettings to support groups for mental health/disability groups to be encouraged. Alongside this, a closer involvement with those already renting the premises would be beneficial to both parties.


4. Growing Our Churches

There was encouraging news that one or two Junior Church groups are restarting. However, only a small number of young people are interested in, or becoming involved in the life of the church. More youth activities/groups and youth-led services are to be encouraged.

There is a desire for more fellowship outside Sunday services with church community activities, lunch clubs, coffee mornings. Opportunities for learning and development.

Increased emphasis should be put on caring for, supporting, and actively visiting elderly and sick members of our churches.

More engaging social events both internally, and involving the wider community should be considered and facilitated to extend the churches visibility in its community, strengthen fellowship, build relationships and reach out to ALL sections of the local community as we witness to Gods presence here in the Blackheath & Crystal Palace Circuit.

Notes from the 'Way Forward' group meeting on 18th July 2024

Circuit Restructuring:

Having taken on board the comments and concerns regarding the proposed Circuit Restructuring, the Way Forward Group approved the circulation of a document produced by the Circuit Leadership Team setting out various options for further discussion. This document will be available to everyone, and is to be circulated widely, by both electronic and physical means, to ensure it is available to all. There will be a facility to submit comments about this document via an online google form, or by paper copy of the same questionnaire which will be made widely available. All replies must be submitted by **6th September 2024**. Responses will then be collated and will be available by 14th September.

To facilitate further group discussion, the Way Forward Group is organising a Circuit-wide gathering called 'Our Circuit, Our Future' on Saturday 14th September at Burnt Ash, 10am to 1pm.

Way Forward Group: Looking ahead

Mission Planning:

A summary of the Mission Plans produced by eight churches in the Circuit was presented at the Circuit Meeting on 11th July at Sunfields; the report included earlier in this newsletter additionally includes responses from the nineth church. While some churches have been limited in their response and submitted what is effectively a 'Mission Statement' rather than a forward plan, many others have obviously spent a considerable amount of time reviewing, questioning, reaching out, and finally drawing together a cohesive plan for their future.

It is recognised that some churches have very complex issues looming in the next few years and are to be commended for dealing constructively with the various options they may need to consider.

Our Circuit churches have very individual needs, and in many areas are prepared to work towards their goals themselves, having good ideas and plans in place to do so. In other areas it is apparent that external help, either from the Circuit, or more widely, is needed.

However, the Circuit should feel encouraged that initiatives have been well thought through and there is a feeling of genuine commitment that comes through from the Mission planning documents.

It is, however, recognised that while many people within our churches already feel 'overworked', there is a desire to offer more opportunities for new people to help. The current exercise of drawing up job descriptions might more effectively use the skills and talents within our churches, and develop a better awareness of the effective use of resources within each role.

The Way Forward Group meets via zoom and is open to anyone who wishes to contribute to discussions regarding the future of the Circuit in terms of Spiritual Growth and Restructuring. If you are interested in finding out more, please contact Garry Young youngall@btinternet.com
