Superintendent Minister's Letter

Friends,

Rev. Richard began his last letter to the circuit in the July newsletter reflecting on a famous passage from Ecclesiastes that depicts the different times and seasons of life that we experience both as individuals and communities.

When I was a teenager I decided Ecclesiastes was a book I'd like to study more, inspired by the beautiful poetry of the passage Richard referenced (3:1-5), which I'd heard at many a funeral and the rich imagery of Ecclesiastes 4 (9-12), often a scripture chosen at weddings, where we find a call to collaboration and unity, and a reliance on God, just as two chords are stronger than one, so too when three strands are held together they can not easily be broken. Both these passages would seem to offer wisdom, challenge and encouragement to us as a circuit amid transition.

However, if like the teenage me, these were the only passages of Ecclesiastes you are familiar with, you might be surprised to know that the rest of the book isn't quite as hope abounding and cheerful.

It is both a privilege and a humbling joy to write to you for the first time in my new role as Superintendent Minister for our Circuit. As I've been preparing for this transition, I've found myself returning often to the words of Ecclesiastes: "There is nothing new under the sun." (1:9)

It might not seem the most cheerful way to introduce myself as superintendent! But there's something deeply honest about the writer's voice — someone who is not afraid to name life's frustrations, perplexities, and limitations. The author of Ecclesiastes surveys the world and finds repetition, weariness, injustice, and paradox. Plans unravel. Efforts go unnoticed. Goodness is not always rewarded. The world, in all its cycles, can seem tiringly familiar.

And yet, I find there is a strange comfort in this. The challenges we face today — uncertainty in our churches, questions about the future of ministry, the shifting ground

of society and faith — are not unique to us. Others have walked this road before. Others have wrestled, doubted, lamented, and still held on.

“There is nothing new under the sun” reminds us that we are not alone. The Church has navigated many changes over the centuries. The people of God have endured exile, hardship, revival, and renewal. The struggles we feel now — of identity, purpose, and mission — are part of a wider, ancient journey of faith.

But Ecclesiastes doesn’t leave us in despair. Tucked between its sometimes bleak observations are moments of quiet, profound wisdom: to enjoy simple gifts; to work with integrity; to remember God; and to live with reverence and humility. It is in those moments that hope quietly breathes.

And so, as we begin this new season together, my prayer is that we do not fear the familiar struggles, but that we face them with open hearts. The Spirit continues to stir, hope continues to breathe. Though there may be nothing new under the sun, God’s mercies are new every morning. And that, perhaps, is the greater truth.

As we journey this next season together, we do so with a trust that God will work through us, not in spite of our challenges, but within them. So let us walk together with honesty, curiosity, and faith, listening for what the Spirit is saying — and leaning into the hope that God still holds the future.

It may seem rather odd to be welcoming Craig to our Circuit as he has been with us since 2021. During that time, he has moved from being a Probationer to an Ordained Minister, and has had the oversight of Burnt Ash, Hither Green, and Sunfields Methodist Churches. His mission initiatives have included, among other things, a focus on Youth, with Circuit Youth Services, Confirmation classes for young people and 3Gen.

Craig is now embarking on a new phase of his ministry as he takes on the post of Superintendent Minister, with pastoral oversight for Burnt Ash, Forest Hill, and Hither Green Methodist Churches. This will be a challenge as the staff team reduces from four to three ministers, and the Circuit transitions to a new configuration. This welcome service is as opportunity for the Circuit to come together to not only celebrate with Craig and Louise as they engage with this new opportunity, but to show our support for them as they take a step into the unknown.

The service will be led by Rev. Dr. Jonathan Dean, Chair of the London District. All are welcome, and indeed it is hoped that this will be a well-supported service of celebration and prayer in support of Craig and Louise. The offertory taken will be donated to the Fund for the Support of Presbyters and Deacons. Richard had chosen two Charles Wesley hymns, ‘Ye Servants of God, Your Master Proclaim’, and ‘Give Me the Faith Which Can Remove’, but the service also included two ‘newer’ hymns, ‘One More Step along the World I Go’ by Sydney Carter, and ‘I, the Lord of Sea and Sky’ by Daniel Schutte. With thanks to Martin Cleave who played the organ for the service and also arranged for a string quartet to play before, during and after the service. Grateful thanks are extended to Sylvia Seaton (violin), Becky Martin (violin), Jane Davis (viola) and David Lee (Cello). The musical items were warmly received by those present, as was a very special sung version of 23rd Psalm presented by children from Eltham Park Methodist Church under the guidance of Minelva Cocks.

Warm and heartfelt spoken tributes were given by Alecia Austin on behalf of Lewisham Methodist Church, and Jackie Ingram on behalf of Eltham Park Methodist Church, both churches that have known Richard as their minister. Winston Fraser (Hither Green) and Judy Crane-St.Hill (Sunfields) also spoke of the impact Richard’s ministry has had at their churches. Linda Ryan spoke as Circuit Administrator and on behalf of Burnt Ash and the LPs’ & WLs’ meeting. She said it had been a pleasure working with Richard, who has always acted with fairness and impartiality, listening to everyone’s concerns, however difficult the issue.

Although the role of Superintendent Minister is not always an easy one, Richard has always sought to act in fairness, seeking an equitable and workable solution. His easy warmth, listening ear and pastoral care have made him many friends in the Circuit.



Garry Young spoke on behalf of the Blackheath and Crystal Palace Circuit; causing some amusement when he commented that one of the outstanding features of Richard's seven years in the Circuit was his sabbatical! It was during that time that Richard prepared the Lent study course based on the book of Amos, which was taken up by the District, and widely used and very much appreciated. Indeed, Richard's Bible study and scriptural insight were much appreciated aspects of his ministry, alongside the weekly in person services across the Circuit, and the on-line services he prepared (with Carol's help) during covid lockdown.

Richard was presented with a monetary gift from the Circuit. He then responded by using personal testimony in affirming his belief in the ever-present Jesus walking beside him through the periods of joy or difficulty. He spoke of the love and support given to him by his wife Carol, and the many friends he has made during his time in the Circuit.

Richard and Carol will be missed; every good wish goes with them as Richard takes up the Superintendency of the Croydon Circuit. He has been a 'safe pair of hands' and we are thankful that he has passed on his experience and expertise in the role that Craig now takes on. Everyone wished both Richard and Carol all the best as they move to their new Circuit – in close enough proximity that we hope this will be 'ciao' for now and 'ci rivedremo presto'. Those present were invited to join Richard and Carol for refreshments after the service; grateful thanks to those at Eltham Park who served tea/coffee and provided a selection of delicious cakes.

Report from the 'Way Forward Group'

'Digital Evangelism'

In the digital age of communication, the internet is a crucial platform for evangelism, particularly for younger generations who are estimated to spend over 15 hours a day online, but also for those who are isolated, housebound, or far from home. Together, we seek to understand, explore, and innovate around what it means to be followers of Jesus in digital space.

The digital world is a mission field like any other. We hope to explore it to grow our church, spread the word of God and meet our CALLING. Evidence shows that 94% of people use social media and 58% of millennials believe that digital platforms have made it easier for them to share their faith. Many others look online for churches when moving into an area. It is very important that we upgrade our digital presence using the latest techniques and strategies, while also paying attention to concerns like security, safeguarding, GDPR, copyright, etc. The Methodist Church Digital Team has created a learning programme of 24 short videos, including:

Many churches have already adopted this exciting initiative, and we hope that churches in our Circuit will engage and support the initiative. Members of the Way Forward Group are actively researching options and have contacted experts in this field. They hope shortly to put together an action plan for approval. It may be possible to apply for District Funding. Further details will be presented at the upcoming Circuit Meeting.

FOR ANY CIRCUIT CHURCH THAT DOES NOT ALREADY HAVE A DEFIBRILLATOR

London Hearts is a registered charity providing **life-saving heart defibrillators** throughout the entire of the UK. They currently have funding schemes running which enable them to provide the equipment at reduced costs. Their schemes are run on a first come first served basis; once funding has been exhausted the schemes will close. As with all previous schemes they have run, demand is high, so you should act promptly. The only eligibility requirements are:

- To share with any interested third party our free online recorded CPR/Defibrillator awareness training which we will provide via email at point of dispatch
- Responsible for ongoing maintenance ie., simple routine visual checks, replacing of battery and pads when required.
- External Defibrillators are for installation on an external wall and a power supply is required. Once installed External Defibrillators must be registered with the ambulance service via www.thecircuit.uk
